January Series: “Promise Keepers: God's Faithfulness to His People”

I read one Bible scholar who said that THE most important event in the thousands of years in between the fall of Adam and Eve and the birth of Christ is found in Genesis 12 – the call of Abram. Here the Story of Everything Ever shifts from the dramatic, global events of Genesis chapters 1-11 and zooms in on one family. In Genesis 12, the Lord seems to change tactics in his mission to reverse the curse of sin and death throughout the cosmos. No longer would he send global judgments (like a great flood) to deal with global sin. His

plan now is to create a special people for himself from one man, Abram of Ur, whose offspring will become the conduit of God’s blessing to the sin-sick world. God tells Abram, “in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed” (Gen. 12:3). The family of Abram would become “a great nation” (Gen. 12:2).

This promise from Genesis 12 gets fleshed out in Genesis 13-22. We see that it involves three key aspects: blessing, land, and offspring. So how’s it going? Let’s take each one in turn. Blessing: God told Abram, “I will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse.” So far we’ve seen this play out in multiple ways. The strange priest, Melchizedek, blesses Abram after his military victory in which he rescued his nephew, Lot, in chapter 14. And Abram subsequently tithes his fortune to Melchizedek. He gives him a tenth of his considerable net worth. In Genesis 20, we saw King Abimelech, the king of Gerar, bless Abram (now Abraham), and consequently his household is healed and beings to flourish like never before. Even the pagan

nations are invited to partake in God’s blessing through Abraham. And yet we’ve also seen Lot, Abraham’s nephew, and Ishmael, the son of Abraham and Sarah’s servant, Hagar, both walk away from God’s program, rejecting the blessings of God. We’re still waiting for one who can bring blessing to the world and overcome the curse of sin and death. Blessing status: Partially fulfilled.

What about the land that God had promised to Abraham? God had told him, “Go from your country and your kindred and your father's

house to the land that I will show you" (Gen. 12:1). Abraham was a wandering patriarch – remember he ended up in Egypt where he lied to Pharaoh? Then he ends up parting ways with Lot who chooses the land of Sodom. We know what happened there ... But Abraham winds up back in Canaan, but he has no land of his own. He's basically renting someone's space and biding his time.

When my car was in the shop a while back, my warranty covered a rental car. At first, they put me in the smallest car I could imagine. I barely fit in it, and my family certainly did not. I had to floor it just to get up a hill. I called and asked them if they had anything bigger. "The only option," they said, "is a big, brand-new pickup truck." "I'll take that," I said. It was awesome! I drove that thing around town and felt like a big deal. But the truth was it wasn't mine. That's how Abraham felt in Canaan, the Promised Land. Even though he lived there, he had nothing to call his own. Land status: Unfulfilled.

But, in Genesis 21, we finally saw the beautiful story of God's fulfillment of his promises in the birth of Isaac, the long-awaited promised child of Abraham and his wife, Sarah. He is the miracle only-child whose birth made his parents and everyone around them laugh – Isaac, the son of laughter. We ended our series in September of last year with the example of Abraham's growing faith in God's promises displayed in Genesis 22. He was willing to take Isaac, his only son, up to Mount Moriah and sacrifice him to the Lord, yet the Lord provided the sacrifice in Isaac's place. Offspring status: Fulfilled.

What will become of these promises? Will God do what he said he would do? This month, as we pick back up the story of Genesis, we are going to see Moses, the great storyteller, tie up a few loose ends as the Lord passes the baton from Abraham to Isaac. In Genesis 23, we see Abraham finally come to possess a piece of the Promised Land. And then in chapter 24, we see the Lord provide for more offspring through providing a wife for Isaac. Finally, in chapter 25, we will see the blessing of the Lord pass down, not through the half-dozen sons of Abraham's concubine, not through the dozen royal sons of Abraham's mistress, but through the fledgling, solitary line of Isaac. The lesson for us is the one that Abraham finally learned – the Lord is both sovereign and good. He has a plan, and it's infinitely better than ours. He can do anything, and it's our job to simply trust and obey. May that be our aim this January and beyond.
